Works directly with engineers. Manages the operations of an organization's technology and produces technical documentation.

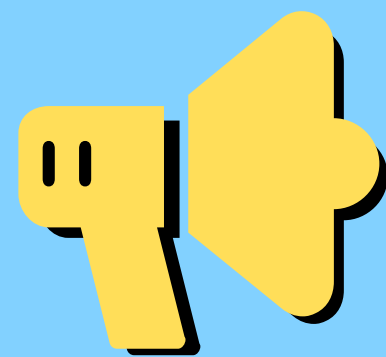


### User Assistance Designer
